What is a memorial donation?

A memorial donation — large or small — is a donation made to commemorate a beloved friend or family member who has passed away. Some survivors specifically request that mourners make memorial gifts to the Columbia Basin Cancer Foundation. In some cases, mourners may make a memorial gift of their own accord.

How does the Columbia Basin Cancer Foundation use memorial donations?

Memorial donations are used to help current cancer patients and their families with transportation expenses, dietary needs, emotional support, and other needs on a case by case basis. Your donation could help a family get their child to treatment, help a woman find a wig, or supply a patient with lodging while undergoing intensive treatment.

How can I make a memorial donation?

Simply send the donation to the Columbia Basin Cancer Foundation with a short note indicating who the gift is intended to commemorate. We will send notification of your gift (although not the amount) to the deceased's spouse or children. We will also send an acknowledgement of the gift to you.

How do I arrange for memorial donations to be made in honor of a recently deceased loved one?

The best way to suggest memorial donations be made is to mention it in your loved one's obituary. If you can, include the Columbia Basin Cancer Foundation's address so that people will know where to send their gift. We can also provide additional copies of this brochure in order to make them available at the location of the funeral. If you can, please let us know that you plan to request memorial gifts.
